#### Call to Order:

Bob Boyle, MD, Chair, called the January Board meeting to order at 1:00 pm.

#### Minutes:

Minor corrections recommended by Carla Collins and Gwen Taylor, Vice-Chair. Lain O'Ferrall motioned to accept the recommended changes and approve the December Board minutes. Gwen Taylor, Vice-Chair, seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

#### Finance:

Candace Thomas reviewed the financials reports. Program currently has \$235 million in investments compared with \$186 million last year (January 2009). Gwen Taylor, Vice-Chair, motioned to accept the December Financial reports. Susan Grisham seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

George Deebo shared a few highlights of 2009 with the Board that consisted of highest physician participation (648), highest level of hospital participation (38), highest total annual income (\$30.36 million), highest participating physician and hospital income, and highest level of financial reserves (\$235 million).

#### Investment:

Lain O'Ferrall stated that for the YTD for 2009 investments has a gain of 21%. Investments for the first quarter are up by 3.3%. Lain O'Ferrall states revenue has increased steadily over the past five years.

#### **Public Comment:**

Bill McKelway inquired about the final amount of embezzlement case. George Deebo stated that the final report had not been completed, but that the amounts were about the same.

Bill McKelway inquired about input from the Board on current willful neglect cases that are pending in circuit court.

Bill McKelway also questioned whether or not the Board thought the level of injury would be considered in a willful neglect case. George Deebo responded that it was an open question.

Bill McKelway inquired about payer of last resort. Is there a clear line between Medicaid and the Program as being payer of last resort? George Deebo stated that the Program has been payer of last resort and there have been few problems. Generally, if a claim is denied by Medicaid, the Program does pay.

Susan Grisham asked if any children were on Medicare. George Deebo stated that he was not aware of any.

#### **Executive Director's Report:**

George Deebo stated that interviews were being conducted this week with attorneys regarding possible civil settlement in connect with the embezzlement case. After the interview committee has selected a firm, the recommendation will be brought back to the Board for final approval.

George Deebo informed the Board that it may be necessary to reschedule the February Board meeting due to the impending embezzlement case scheduled for trial February 8<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>. After a brief discussion, Board members selected to meet on Friday, February 19<sup>th</sup> in lieu of Tuesday, February 9<sup>th</sup> if needed.

The impending trial will may also impact the next scheduled Investment Committee meeting which Candace Thomas suggested could be moved to the March Board Meeting. Candace Thomas will notify the committee members once new date has been confirmed.

George Deebo informed the Board that there are now two positions available on the Board. We will need someone with a CPA background and investment experience.

#### Adjournment:

#### Finance:

Candace Thomas reviewed the June 2010 financials. Lain O'Ferrall asked about total income received to date. It was reported to be \$26 million. He wanted to know if any additional monies would be received. Candace Thomas answered that the majority of the assessments have been received with a few that will still come in but not in any substantial amount. Total Income is about the same as it was last year this time. Lain O'Ferrall also asked about Administrative Expenses. The Programs' Administrative Expenses account for 8% of Total Income. Susan Grisham asked about the Refund of Overpayment. Candace Thomas stated these are monies that are paid back to either the physician or physician's offices when overpayment is made on behalf of the physician or if a physician leaves the practice, the Program prorates the amount refunded. Lain O'Ferrall motioned to accept the financial reports. Susan Grisham seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

#### Investment:

Lain O'Ferrall stated that the Investment Committee met prior to the Board meeting with Jim Rorrer of CapGroup. The possibility of moving up to 10% into alternative investments, in-line with the practices of most institutional funds similar to the Program was discussed in the

meeting. Jim Rorrer with CapGroup will be at the September Board meeting to make a presentation regarding alternative funds and *to* answer any questions the Board may have.

Gwen Taylor asked if the Board would be discussing the Audit Report. George Deebo stated it was not on the agenda for this meeting, but he could put it on the agenda for the September meeting. The only remedy was an additional lift on the rear of the home. The first lift was paid for by the EDCD waiver through Medicaid.

### Clarification regarding family-caregiver requests as approved by the Board of Directors on November 9, 2010

#### **Pre-Program Admission:**

If the request is for reimbursement of services rendered prior to the claimant's admission into the Program, the Program will reimburse retroactively to July 1, 2008, unless the claimant's date of birth occurred after that date. In that case, the Program will reimburse retroactively to the date of birth. However, all required documentation must be submitted and accepted by the Program within two years of the Program admission date, as with all pre-admission reimbursement requests.

#### Post Program Admission:

The Program will allow retroactive reimbursement for services rendered up to one year prior to the first request for reimbursement pursuant to the family caregiver benefit. However, all required documentation must be submitted and accepted by the Program within one year following the date of service, as with all post-admission requests for reimbursement.

For each of the situations above the following documentation must be received and approved by the Program prior to any reimbursement:

- 1. Release and Waiver of Liability, Discharge, Covenant Not to Sue, and Indemnity Agreement of Admitted Claimant (notarized).
- 2. Release and Waiver of Liability, Discharge, Covenant Not to Sue, and Indemnity Agreement by Caregiver (notarized).
- 3. Certification, Waiver and Release Regarding Family Member Caregiver's or Independent Caregiver's Prior Criminal History.
- 4. Family Member Caregiver Competency Certification.

Important Note: No prospective family caregiver who has been convicted of an offense listed as a barrier crime according to Virginia Code §372-314, 372-416 or 372-506 can be hired or reimbursed as a claimant's caregiver.

All usual and customary Program Guidelines that apply will be applied. Those include, but are not be limited to:

-A treating physician's letter of medical necessity must be received prescribing allowable number of hours

- -All required care documentation must be submitted to include signed and dated timesheets and monthly report forms. After the initial request for the benefit is made (during the post admission period), the requests for reimbursement and the supporting documentation must be submitted each month as set forth in the Guidelines.
- As with all care reimbursed by the Program, the caregiver must be solely providing care to the claimant during those hours
- As with all care reimbursed by the Program the caregiver must be awake and attentive to the claimant during those hours.

The rate of reimbursement will be as prescribed in the Program Guidelines.
